1. Be an Ordeal member for at least 10 months.
2. Be an active member of your Scout unit.
3. Be an active, paid member of Tsali Lodge.
4. Write a letter to the Lodge Secretary (Kevin Elliot).
5. Know the signs that show your membership within the OA
 - The Obligation (p. 10, OA Handbook)
 - The Admonition (ask someone, it's just one word)

-The OA Song (p.13, OA Handbook)

-The OA Handclasp (p.27, OA Handbook)

-The Sign of Ordeal Membership: Allowat Sakima describes it in the Ordeal ceremony, "The hailing sign of the ordeal is made with the right hand over the left shoulder, moving as if drawing an arrow from a quiver."

6. To gain a better understanding of the Ordeal, review the questions found on pages 52-54 of the OA Handbook.
