




OA HIGH ADVENTURE

LODGE ELECTIONS



Lodge Chief:

Presides at all Lodge Executive Board Meetings, supervises all Lodge Vice-Chiefs and committee chairmen and sees that they carry out their duties, sees that all Lodge functions are properly planned for and conducted, consults regularly with the Lodge Lay and Staff Advisers; voting member of Daniel Boone Council Executive Board and Camping Committee; attends section Council of Chiefs meetings. Ensures that the Lodge Charter is properly renewed each year in consultation with the Key 3.

Lodge Vice-Chief of Administration: Second-in-command of the lodge. Assists the Lodge Chief to operate lodge functions and assumes the position of Acting Lodge Chief in the absence of the Lodge Chief. Publishes the annual Lodge Planbook. Ensures there is an elections team to facilitate Unit Elections and ensures that election results are properly communicated to the Lodge Leadership. Ensures requirements are met for all Brotherhood Conversions. Oversees all administrative functions and committees of the lodge. Promotes camping to local troops in the Daniel Boone Council.

Lodge Vice-Chief of Program: Responsible for the planning of Lodge Fellowships, Ordeals, and Banquets. Plans the activities, menu, and service projects for those events. Organizes and leads the Lodge's quest events team at the annual Section Conclave. Recruits and trains Elangomats in coordination with the Lodge Training Chairman to assist with the induction of new members. Operates as Head Elangomat/ Ordeal Master at all new member inductions. Responsible for all Program related Committees.

Lodge Vice-Chief of Indian Affairs:

Organizes and leads the lodge's Cherokee Indian-based group dance, individual dance, drum, and ceremonies competition teams. Plans and arranges practices for these teams and ensures they can perform at competitions and lodge events. Oversees all ceremonial activities of the Lodge. Ensures all Cherokee Indian-based activities are respectful to the cultures on which they are based. Facilitates the research for competitive events. Responsible for all Indian Affairs committees.

Each year at Fall Fellowship, Lodge elections are held for the youth members to elect the Lodge officers for the following year.


Each lodge member under the age of 21, who has paid their dues for the year, is in good standing, and is physically present, is entitled to 1 vote. Adult Scouters, age 21 or older, do not have a vote in matters of lodge and/or chapter business.

The new officers attend their first Lodge Executive Committee Meeting right after the fellowship weekend activities with the outgoing Lodge officers to help with transition of Lodge leadership. (11AM Dining Hall)

LODGE ELECTIONS



Lodge Vice-Chief of Conclave/Host Lodge Coordinator:

Elected to office during Conclave host year and during other years as deemed necessary by the Lodge Chief in consultation with the Lodge Adviser, approval by the Scout Executive, and subsequent approval of the LEC. The elected term of the Lodge Vice-Chief of Conclave ends at the same time as the other elected Lodge Vice-Chiefs. Responsible for the planning and successful execution of Tsali Lodge's hosting of the annual Section Conclave. Presents the Host Lodge proposal for the Section Conclave guidelines to the Section COC at their annual meeting. Promotes the annual Conclave to the Lodge membership and to other Lodges. Oversees Conclave hosting committees during Conclave host year. Next host year = 2030.

Lodge Treasurer:

Responsible for monitoring all lodge financial accounts, as well as giving regular finance reports to the LECM. Also responsible for creating an annual budget, in conjunction with the key 3. Oversees assigned committees.

Lodge Secretary:

Responsible for taking minutes at all Lodge Executive Meetings, copying those notes, and submitting them to the Lodge Chief for distribution before the next Executive Meeting. Completes official Lodge correspondence. Ensures proper communications within the Lodge. Ensures the website is maintained and regularly updated. Ensures the Lodge Newsletter is published at least six times per year and includes promotion and reports of all Lodge Activities. Oversees assigned committees.

Chapter Chief and Vice Chiefs:

Each chapter of Tsali Lodge shall elect a Chapter Chief. Chapter Chiefs have the option to appoint, when appropriate, Chapter Vice Chief(s), and a Chapter Secretary. The Chapter Chief of each chapter shall appoint chapter committees as needed from time to time in consultation with the Chapter Adviser and shall appoint community service teams to promote camping and unit elections in all communities of the chapters. Chapters will not have either a finance committee or a treasurer.



If you are a youth member of the Lodge, we encourage you to consider becoming involved with Tsali as a Lodge officer and running for election.

There are more positions available than just what is listed here as the elected officers. Other positions include the website chair, membership chair, OA high adventure chair, ceremonies chair and team members, drum chair and team members, dance chair and team members, and fire warriors.
