September's Featured Patch

Here are 2 flaps that I personally really like that are called the "Dragonball" set. These flaps were designed by Todd Knaperek and I got this info directly from him. He said "I purposely made this a small order, multi-bordered designed to give the lodge a high valued flap to turn around the economics of our patches, which to this day still seem to have held. So I drew up the design, since the event was at Indiana University and Tsali was expected to have a low attendance like we did for 98 (where only three youth and two adults made up our lodge contingency). We decided to do just a short run of flaps...100, like we did in 98. And then, we decided to divide those 100 flaps into two different colored borders, 60 blue and 40 black to make them more desirable for collectors. I then went out and had them ordered through Atlas Apparel which was out of Athens, Georgia and had them shipped to my apartment in Boone when I was at App State. I personally handed the flaps off to the lodge adviser at the next OA event. I went with Atlas because unlike Krelman and other companies, they wouldn't sell off duplicates they had to third parties, with the exception of one which was kept in their records. The idea appeared to work, the flaps were some of the hardest to get a hold of and up until a couple of years ago, no counterfeits of them were produced. Even then I think those were very few as the internet isn't flooded with the flaps. The idea helped get us some much needed valuable flaps in our inventory." Obtaining a pair of these for your collection will be challenging. 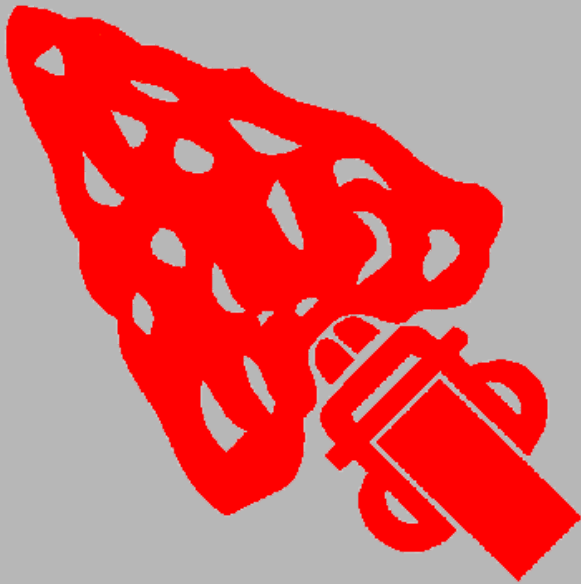
